Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by A. Navarro at 2:10PM.

1. Review minutes of 2/16/06.

The following changes/corrections were made: list Dr. Moyer as absent; correction on K. Pfeiffer's last name; page 3, (l) should read: Beaulieu inquired whether the college *should*... Second last paragraph should read: Deputy Garcia said he is hoping that another route will be constructed...

2. Facilities Update – L. Guidry

The latest bond newsletter as well as bon projects highlights were distributed. Starting March 20, 2006, the Cesar Chavez/Collegian intersection will be closed for three weeks. Alternative routes to access parking lots on Collegian Avenue are: via Floral Drive or Carl's Junior parking lot. The members emphasized the importance of announcing this major closure as soon as possible and as widely as possible.

President Moreno suggested putting signage up immediately starting on Atlantic Boulevard, to give notice of the closure. Once the intersection is closed, updated signage should indicate this too and direct motorists of alternative routes. The buses affected by this closure will also be re-routed. G. Mendoza will be contacted to post this announcement via email to faculty and staff. R. Isomoto said he had an interview with Campus News and intends to disclose this information.

a) Exterior of Parking Structure 3 - WWCOT

- WWCOT was asked to redesign the front façade of the parking structure as well as the two wings on the sides.
- Committee members were shown renderings of the redesigned façade of the parking structure. The façade consists of modern brick banding, which ties in with the rest of the buildings to be constructed, along with a ‘youthful’ metal mesh. There is ELAC signage at the entrance of the parking structure, beneath the canopy. The renderings with more brick banding was more expensive and would put the project out of budget.
- There will be floodlights beneath the canopy at the entrance as well as on the ground.

b) Math Science Complex fly-through – HGA Architects/E7 Studio

- The fly-through was put together by three students from Trade Tech and ELAC.
- The Math/Science complex has three lecture halls; it also has exterior stairs. There is a lower level which has windows in the back. One can walk through the complex to the other side. The architects announced that 30 feet had been shaved off the building. Faculty concerns over the access between PFAC and Math/Science complex seem to have been addressed.
- K. Pfeiffer suggested that there should be a seating area, preferably with a cafeteria where students can sit and relax.
- President Moreno said the F5 building will have a campus center with a food service area. He added that there ought to be a barrier around the garden area in front of the complex to avoid students sitting or playing on it.
- John Grimmer said one of the problems with H5 buildings are the sidewalks next to the buildings which are too noisy whenever students are walking by. This noise is compounded by the echoes.

- L. Pilcher said the project will be completed a year ahead of schedule because it will be built all at once instead of in stages and had been the plan when the complex was in segments.
- The Math/Science complex is on budget.
